The program

Name: Equity Cubed Community Ventures

Parkdale is a dynamic and evolving community of about 24,000 that continues to attract residents and visitors with its unique atmosphere, diverse history, and strong sense of community. It is known for having a large population of residents living on low incomes, including newcomers, immigrants, and other vulnerable community members. The neighborhood is facing rapid changes and is experiencing increased gentrification, particularly in the areas north of Queen Street, leading to rising rents and displacement of low-income residents. Parkdale is home to various organizations dedicated to addressing the needs of low-income residents, including the Parkdale Peoples Economy, Parkdale Neighborhood Land Trust, PARC | Parkdale Activity Recreation Centre, and others. Parkdale has a wide range of community services, including housing support, healthcare, counselling, and programs for youth, seniors, and newcomers.

Equity Cubed Community Ventures is managed by Equity Cubed, a majority Indigenous owned, purpose-driven business. We are currently working to find local partners who can collaborate with us on program delivery.

The program will begin in mid-October 2025 and conclude in September 2026. Throughout the year, we will offer a range of activities, including workshops, training sessions, networking events, and community forums.

Uniqueness of Our Approach

Equity Cubed offers a place for social ventures to experiment and operate at the cutting edge of impact. Using an Indigenous and ancestral wisdoms lens, and by prioritizing under-represented founders, we support entrepreneurs to tackle society's wicked equity challenges. Our approach is unique in its emphasis on place-based solutions and collective or alternative business models. We believe that by leveraging local assets within a specific neighborhood, and creating the conditions for mutual support among businesses, we can create a cohesive and resilient community.

Our Goal

We aim to expand our reach, increase the number of businesses we support, and deepen our impact on the community. By growing economic resilience, social inclusion, and community cohesion, we hope to be part of building a brighter future for Parkdale.


